Purpose: This document provides you with key information about this investment product. It is not marketing material. The information is required by law to help you understand the nature, risks, costs, potential gains and losses of this product and to help you compare it with other products.

Invesco MSCI Japan ESG Climate Paris Aligned UCITS ETF (the "Fund"), a sub-fund of Invesco Markets II plc (the "Company"), Acc (ISIN: IE000181KC59) (the "Share Class")

PRIIP Manufacturer: Invesco Investment Management Limited, part of the Invesco Group.

The Central Bank of Ireland is responsible for supervising Invesco Investment Management Limited in relation to this Key Information Document. This PRIIP is authorised in Ireland.

Invesco Investment Management Limited is authorised in Ireland and regulated by the Central Bank of Ireland.

Invesco Investment Management Limited as manager of the Company will exercise its rights pursuant to Article 16 of Directive 2009/65/EC.

What is this product?

The Fund is an Exchange-Traded Fund ("ETF") and is a sub-fund of the Company, a company incorporated in Ireland with limited liability as an umbrella type openended UCITS investment company with variable capital and segregated liability between its sub-funds under the laws of Ireland with registered number 567964 and authorised by the Central Bank of Ireland.

The Fund has no maturity date. The Fund may be terminated unilaterally by the directors of the Company and there are circumstances in which the Fund can be terminated automatically, as further described in the prospectus.

Investment objective:

The objective of the Fund is to aim to track the net total return performance of the MSCI Japan ESG Climate Paris Aligned Benchmark Select Index (the "Index"), less fees, expenses and transaction costs, thereby taking an approach that seeks to reduce the Fund's exposure to transition and physical climate risks whilst pursuing opportunities arising from a transition to a lower carbon economy and aligning with the Paris Agreement requirements.

The Index:

The Index tracks the performance of large and mid-capitalisation companies across Japan and aims to reduce exposure to transition and physical climate risks whilst pursuing opportunities arising from the transition to a lower carbon economy while aligning with the Paris Agreement requirements. The Index also provides exposure to companies with high ESG metrics and incorporates the TCFD (Task Force on Climate Related Financial Disclosures) recommendations and is designed to exceed the minimum standards of the EU Paris-Alianed Benchmark as set out in the Commission Delegated Regulation (EU) 2020/1818. The Index is constructed from the MSCI Japan Index (the "Parent Index") by applying the index provider's exclusionary criteria. The remaining constituents are then subject to an optimisation which has the aim of aligning the Index to the objectives of the Paris Agreement by reducing the weighting of companies exposed to climate transition risks, maximising the weighting of companies with the highest exposure to climate transition opportunities and minimising the ex-ante tracking error relative to the Parent Index. The remaining constituents are also subject to a set of diversification and turnover constraints. The Index rebalances on a semi-annual basis.

Investors should note that the Index is the intellectual property of the index provider. The Fund is not sponsored or endorsed by the index provider and a full disclaimer can be found in the Fund's prospectus.

Investment approach:

The Fund is a passively managed Exchange-Traded Fund.

To achieve the investment objective, the Fund will, as far as possible and practicable, hold all the shares in the Index in their respective weightings

The Fund is an Article 8 Fund (it promotes environmental and/or social characteristics) for the purposes of Regulation (EU) 2019/2088 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 27 November 2019 on sustainability-related disclosures in the financial services sector ("SFDR").

The Fund's base currency is USD.

Dividend Policy:

This Share Class does not pay you income, but instead reinvests it to grow your capital, in line with its stated objectives.

Redemption and Dealing of Shares:

The Fund's shares are listed on one or more Stock Exchange(s). Investors can buy or sell shares daily through an intermediary directly or on Stock Exchange(s) on which the shares are traded. In exceptional circumstances investors will be permitted to redeem their shares directly from Invesco Markets II plc in accordance with the redemption procedures set out in the prospectus, subject to any applicable laws and relevant charges.

Intended Retail Investor:

The Fund is intended for investors aiming for long term capital growth, who may not have specific financial expertise but are able to make an informed investment decision based on this document, the supplement, and the prospectus, have a risk appetite consistent with the risk indicator displayed below and understand that there is no capital guarantee or protection (100% of capital is at risk).

The assets of the Fund are segregated as a matter of Irish law and as such, in Ireland, the assets of one sub-fund will not be available to satisfy the liabilities of another sub-fund. This position may be considered differently by the courts in jurisdictions outside of Ireland.

Subject to satisfying certain criteria as set out in the prospectus, investors may be able to exchange their investment in the Fund for shares in another sub-fund of the Company which is being offered at that time.

What are the risks and what could I get in return? **Risk Indicator**



The risk indicator assumes you keep the product for 5 years. The actual risk can vary significantly if you cash in at an early stage and you may get back less

The summary risk indicator is a guide to the level of risk of this product compared to other products. It shows how likely it is that the product will lose money because of movements in the markets or because we are not able to pay

We have classified this product as 4 out of 7, which is a medium risk class. This rates the potential losses from future performance at a medium level, and poor market conditions could impact the ability for you to receive a positive return on your investment.

Be aware of currency risk. In some circumstances, you may receive payments in a different currency from your local currency, so the final return you will get may depend on the exchange rate between the two currencies. This risk is not considered in the indicator shown above.

Performance scenarios

What happens if Invesco Investment Management Limited is unable to pay out?

The assets of the Fund are segregated from those of Invesco Investment Management Limited. In addition, the Bank of New York Mellon SA/NV, Dublin Branch (the "Depositary"), as the depositary of the Company, is responsible for the safekeeping of the assets of the Fund. To that effect, if Invesco Investment Management Limited defaults, there will be no direct financial impact on the Fund. In addition, the assets of the Fund shall be segregated from the Depositary's assets, which may limit the risk for the Fund suffering some loss in case of default by the Depositary. As a shareholder in the Fund, there is no compensation or guarantee scheme in place.

What are the costs?

The person advising on or selling you this product may charge you other costs. If so, this person will provide you with information about these costs and how they affect your investment.

Costs over time

The tables show the amounts that are taken from your investment to cover different types of costs. These amounts depend on how much you invest, how long you hold the product and how well the product does. The amounts shown here are illustrations based on an example investment amount and different possible investment periods.

We have assumed, in the first year you would get back the amount that you invested (0 % annual return). For the other holding period, we have assumed the fund performs as shown in the moderate scenario and the investment is USD 10,000.

How long should I hold it and can I take money out early?

Recommended holding period: 5 years

This Share Class has no required minimum holding period however we have selected 5 years as the recommended holding period as the Share Class invests for the long term therefore you should be prepared to stay invested for at least 5 years.

You can sell your shares in the Share Class during this period, subject to satisfying certain criteria as set out in the prospectus, or hold the investment longer. If you sell some or all of your investment before 5 years the Share Class will be less likely to achieve its objectives, however, you will not incur any additional costs by doing so.
